For instance, in May 2023, Zocdoc expanded its marketplace by adding Urgent Care services, enhancing patient access to in-person or virtual care for acute issues across 200+ specialties and 12k+ insurance plans. This expansion reflects growing demand for convenient and accessible urgent care options, potentially increasing market competition and driving further innovation in service delivery. It also highlights the shift towards digital health solutions and broadens the reach of urgent care services across various specialties and insurance plans.

The U.S. urgent care centers industry is segregated based on service type, ownership, location, and region.

The trauma/injury treatment segment will witness a substantial surge by 2032 due to the high demand for immediate care for non-life-threatening injuries. Urgent care centers are increasingly preferred for treating sprains, fractures, cuts, and other minor traumas, offering faster service than emergency rooms and at a lower cost. The convenience and accessibility of these centers make them a popular choice for patients seeking prompt attention, driving commendable growth in this segment of the market. The physician owned segment will see a notable rise by 2032, propelled by the personalized care and high-quality service these centers offer. Physician ownership often translates to greater control over clinical decisions, leading to better patient outcomes and satisfaction. These centers are typically more responsive to local community needs and can adapt quickly to changes in healthcare demand. The strong reputation and trust associated with physician-owned urgent care facilities drive their dominance in the market.

The South Atlantic urgent care centers market share will expand considerably through 2032, fueled by its rapidly growing population and increasing demand for accessible healthcare services. This region, which includes states like Florida, Georgia, and

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the Carolinas, has seen significant expansion in urgent care facilities to meet the needs of its diverse and aging population. The region's strong economic growth and high healthcare utilization rates further bolster the market, making the South Atlantic a key contributor to market growth.

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
