Key Trends in the Market

Transportation refers to the movement of people, goods, or animals from one place to another, either by road, rail, water, pipeline, or air, involving vehicles such as buses, trains, trucks, or aircrafts. Businesses and consumers may use their own means for transportation through in-house vehicles, or pay for transportation services that are offered by a provider. While the government typically offers public transport options, separate service providers are popular for product transportation.

- The favourable policies of the government aimed towards fulfilling the transportation needs of the urban and rural migrated population has been fuelling the Colombia transportation market. With a growing workforce, there is an increased demand for transportation.
- The thriving pharmaceutical and healthcare sector in Colombia is propelling the demand for efficient transportation services to provide door-to-door, non-emergency, and emergency medical services. The pharmaceutical and healthcare sector also utilised transportation for shipping of products.
- The rising demand for transportation in the manufacturing sector, to improve the supply chain of raw materials is a crucial driving factor of the Colombia transportation market. As several raw materials are produced within the country, streamlined transportation helps speed up overall time to market.
- Emergence of intelligence transportation system, supported by internet of things (IoT), is strengthening transportation capabilities. Customisable transportation systems are increasingly used in aerospace, agriculture, and construction and mining

sector, among others.

- Increasing emphasis on e-buses in the country is revolutionising the transportation sector by reducing the carbon footprint, enabling a greater number of buses on the roads. This eco-friendly factor is anticipated to fuel the Colombia transportation market in the forecast period.

Market Share by Services

Rising urban standards of living in Colombia are further transforming the urban road transportation systems, increasing the demand for the overall transportation market in the country.

Market Share by End Use

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Based on end use, the manufacturing segment accounts for a significant share in the Colombia transportation market. Colombia is a rich source of versatile raw materials, such as coal, gold, coffee, banana, and spices, among others, which are witnessing a heightened demand from various sectors. Also, Colombia has accessibility to more than 4,000 maritime routes with 600+ routes across the world, which is strengthening the water transport sector to improve manufacturing operations. Meanwhile, the thriving construction and mining sector in the country is fuelling the transportation demand to improve the supply chain of raw materials. With heightened demand for new constructions and mining output, the construction and mining end uses of transportation is expected to bolster in the coming years.
